Survey on AI for the SENSE 35th Jubilee

- Given developments in AI, this survey set out to discover how SENSE members view generative AI tools, changes in their language work, and their future
- 79 responses (33%, 239 members), 49 free comments
- All responses were anonymous
- Survey was open for 6 weeks, 14 February – 31 March 2025
- Please note: Not tackling any ethical or copyright issues of GenAI

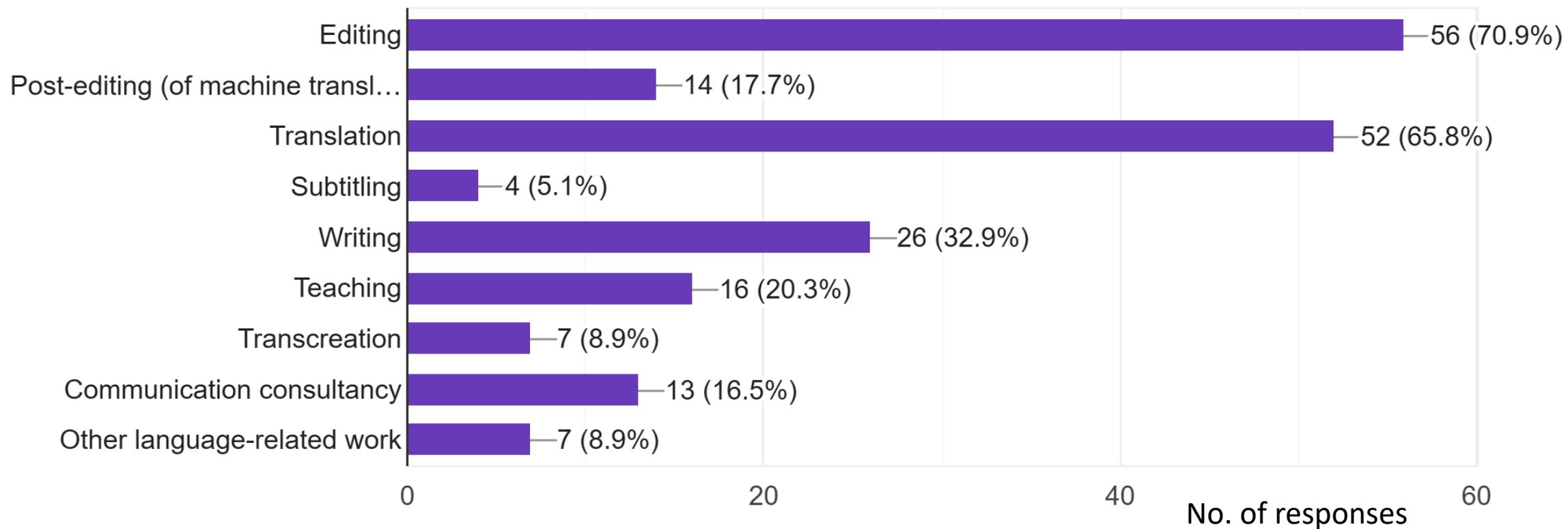


Which of the following best describe your current fields of language-related work?


How long have you worked as a language professional?


How old are you?


Age groups in 2014


Do you use older tools like DeepL, Google Translate, SDL Trados, MemoQ, PerfectIt?

Do you use specific AI tools e.g. ChatGPT, DeepSeek, CoPilot, in your work?




How do you feel about the changes that new AI tools will bring to your work as a language professional?


Have you been specifically asked by a client, publisher or agency to use generative AI tools?

How do you feel about AI tools in general?

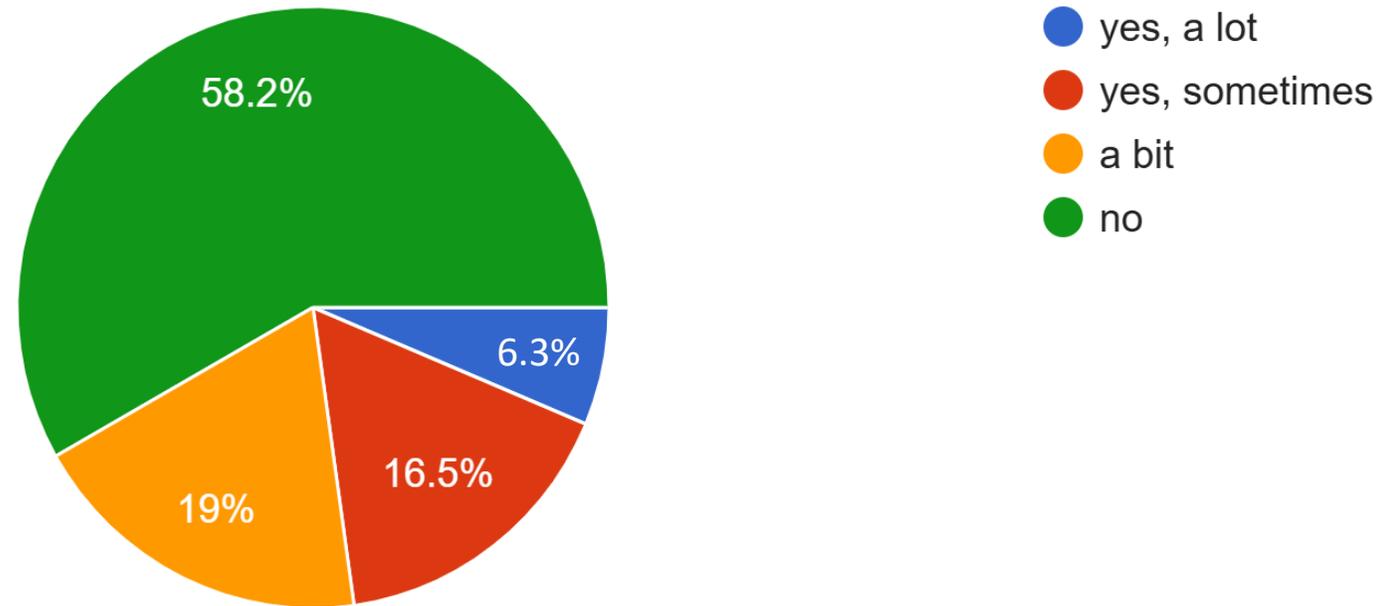




General observations

- Most (86%) LPs use older tools a lot or sometimes
- 2 in 5 (37%) are using AI for work – a bit to a lot
2 in 5 (42%) are using AI for personal tasks - a bit to a lot
- 1 in 5 (17%) feel positive about AI changes in their work
2 in 5 (38%) feel positive about AI tools in general


In the past 5 years, have you expanded your range of language-based work? e.g. with coaching/workshops, teaching language students, organizing writing retreats


In the past 5 years, have you added something totally different to your range of work? e.g. photography, teaching yoga, catering services


Do you have other interests or skills you could market or develop to diversify your work? (or do you have a Plan B?)


For your household income are you, as a language professional:


Do you have other sources of income besides your language work? e.g. as a yoga teacher, photographer, pensioner

Clare Wilkinson's analysis

- Significant associations were seen between all pairwise combinations from four questions about use of and attitudes towards AI
 - *There seems to be a (relatively small) group who have positive attitudes to AI and use it both at work and for personal tasks, and a (larger) group who are neutral or negative and not using AI at all*
 - *Either you're into AI or you're not*

Is age related to use of AI?

- No association between age and use of GenAI at work
- No association between age and attitude to the impact of AI on the profession

→ *However, Clare also wondered whether her assumption (of age being related to use of AI) is outdated given that most LPs will be tech savvy and translators have been using CAT tools for decades*

Is use of AI at work linked to field of work?

- Translators were no less or more likely to be using AI at work than non-translators
- Editors were no less or more likely to be using AI than non-editors
- Writers (incl. transcreation) were no less or more likely to be using AI than other types of language professionals
- Interestingly, people who had been asked by clients to use GenAI were no more likely to use AI at work than anyone else

Are attitudes to the impact of AI on LPs linked to field of work?

- Translators were no more negative (or positive) than non-translators
 - Editors were *slightly* more negative than non-editors
 - Writers (incl. transcreation) were *slightly* more positive than non-writers
 - No difference in attitude between teachers and non-teachers
- ➔ *Use of AI and feelings about it at work are largely unrelated to the kind of work*

Is AI at work linked to business developments in recent years?

- No association between either use of AI at work or attitude to AI's impact on work and whether or not the respondent had added something totally different to their range of work in the past five years
- There was some association with decline in language income over the past two years:
 - People who have experienced a decline in language-related income are *slightly* more likely to be negative about the impact of AI on the language profession
 - People who have experienced a decline in language-related income are less likely to use AI in their work

Comments from survey (49)

- useful responses 30/49
- feel 'safe' – specialized, have good clients 10/49
- other work 12/49
- pension or stopping soon 15/49
- no real response (*asdf*) 4/49
- taking courses/adapting to AI 6/49
- developing new skills 13/49
- feel positive about future 18/49
- feel negative 10/49

Confident comments

- I'm still confident that post-edited AI won't be able to match what I can do for quite a while yet
- My clients still appreciate ... take the initiative to understand what I'm translating, the context ... ask questions, point out potential issues
- I think the [GenAI] issue will die down ... some customers may come back when they see that the human aspect is essential
- I have long-standing, excellent relationships with a number of agencies
- As language professionals we must not shy away from AI
- I am willing to learn to work effectively with AI

and ...

- I believe that diversification is important as a language professional
- I've signed up for business coaching
- I need to convince clients of my value
- I am concentrating on building human connections with my clients based on reliability and trustworthy work
- Am expanding the range of courses I offer

Implications for SENSE

- SENSE was an ageing society in 2015, now we're 10 years older, with the number of members dropping fast ...
- What do the *working* members want to see in the society?
- How relevant can SENSE be for its members?
- How does the society need to change - or should it just retire quietly?
- ➔ SENSE must determine its members' age groups



In the 1980s

The new age of personal computers

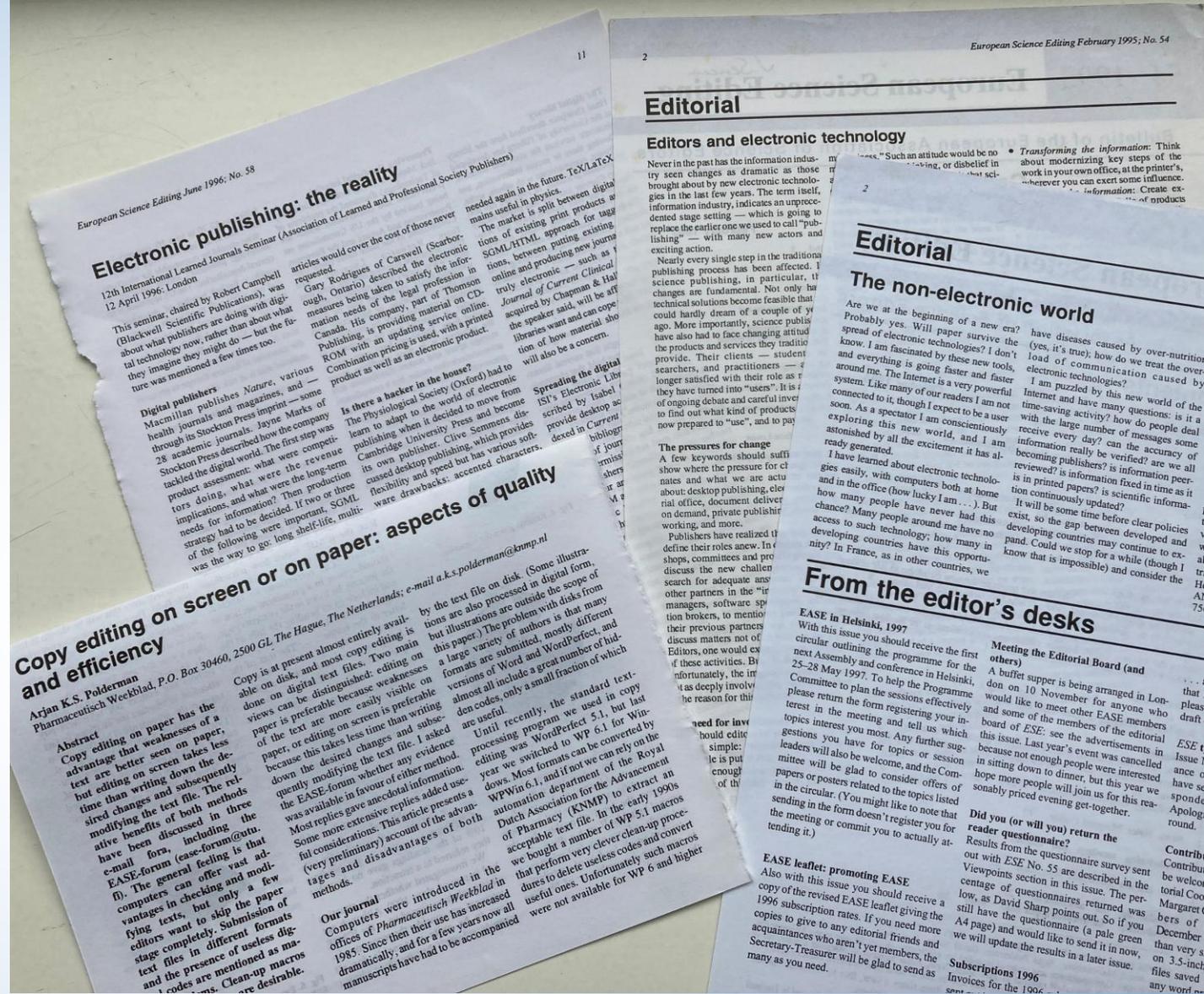
We had a lot to learn!

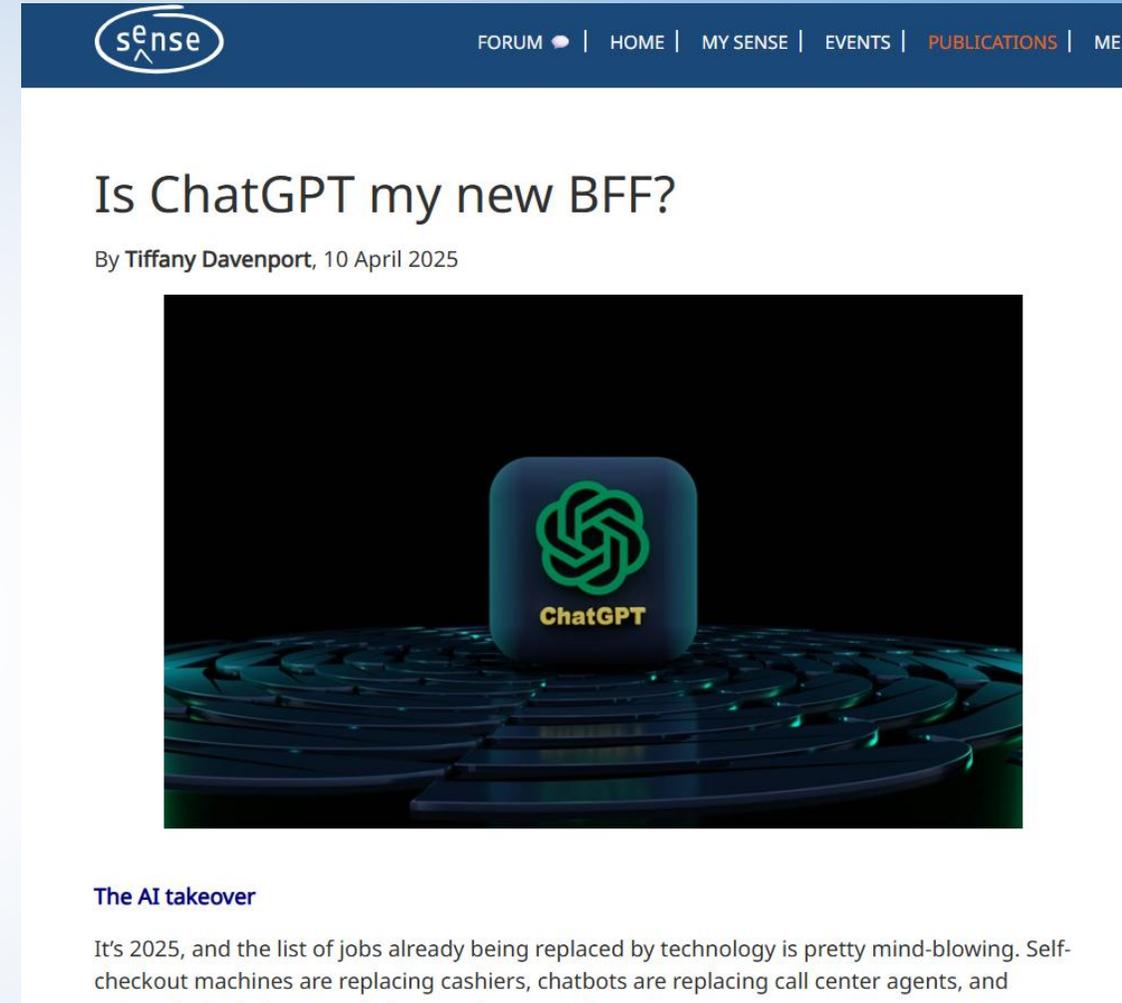
